2. Principal's report:

Academics:

- Real World Learning (Ashley Robinson & Rebecca Mackay leading it on secondary level: looking to plan pollinating trees around school but we need to be mindful of bees and allergies, so out by the school sign suggested. We can then go from pollination to making and selling honey)
- SIEP Literacy/Numeracy/Equity & inclusion/Wellness: "Dibbles" reading test for students (Intermediate) and then specific teaching will occur for that skill to address needs
- SST/LFT: TR Leger was an offshoot programming offered and we are now having that
 programming localized in our school down in the new wing to reduce anxiety (students can
 access room without going through entire school). There is a teacher & "IA" (a teacher adviser).
 It supports students who have got off track for grad to look at alternative ways to catch up in
 order to graduate with their cohort
- 3 New sections offered due to 25 new registrants, so full teacher position for semester#1.
 Courses are 2 sciences and a literacy course
- o Progress Reports will be sent home Oct 16th
- EQAO math in Jan (gr9) and Literacy testing in Nov
- IEPs will be sent home(Oct 17th); De-streaming is now in effect in gr9 for math, English, science, geography and French. Intermediates have a "powerup2" classroom that targets literacy and numeracy (half day withdrawal in mornings) to link back to baseline assessment.
 - Question was asked by Mark S. (a parent) about what "destreamed" meant and Kris
 explained it and Mark W. reinforced that Ontario was one of the last provinces to adopt
 destreaming.
- After school courses: African Drumming (Tues & Thurs 'til mid June for a high school credit),
 Coop (Jen Durant looking after this), & Musical Theatre starts nxt week and will go into late May
- ID lead courses (Ashley Robinson & Erin Burt) for students identifying as indigenous so they can earn an IDC

<u>Directors Work plan shared</u> – reading is our major focus; student culture is at the heart (sense of belong and safe), real world learning, and staff culture.

<u>Spirit Events:</u> Orientation Day was last week in August (Link gr12 class, Web gr8 students); Grade 9 activity day occurred last Fri afternoon with link leaders, Spirit week (a specific theme each day), and a Dance (Thurs night- excellent genuine fun). Next dance will be the Christmas Dance.
